PRIMARY FUNCTION:

Under the immediate supervision of the Director, Special Education/Student Services, the program specialist is responsible for technical support of all special education programs.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Professional

- 1. Meet obligations as specified by the Board of Education and Education Code.
- 2. Comply with state and federal guidelines regarding IDEA.
- 3. Maintain awareness and understanding of current educational trends and developments through professional literature, site and district meetings, and by attending conferences.
- 4. Plan, implement and participate in District and department activities such as staff meetings and Professional Learning Community work.
- 5. Maintain special education student records.
- 6. Compile and analyze data as required.
- 7. Maintain standard of promptness in carrying out assignments.
- 8. Maintain personal standards of grooming compatible with school, district and community expectations.

Direct Service and Consultation

- 1. Observe, assist and consult with general education, special day class teachers, Specialized Academic Instructors and designated instruction and services personnel.
- 2. Model appropriate instruction and management of special education groups or classes. Coach teachers on improving their practice.
- 3. Plan programs, coordinate curricular resources and assist in evaluating the effectiveness of programs for individuals with exceptional needs.
- 4. Assist with special education curriculum development and implementation.
- 5. Provide coordination, consultation and program development in areas of expertise.
- 6. Responsible for assuring special education pupils have full educational opportunity regardless of the district of residence.
- 7. Plan, lead and participate in staff development, program development and innovation of special methods and approaches.

- 8. Serve as a resource in the identification, selection, and use of instructional materials.
- 9. Participate as a member of IEP teams as appropriate.
- 10. Assist special education personnel in implementing and coordinating the services in the IEP.
- 11. Assist in the articulation of special education students between preschool, elementary, middle school, and secondary schools.
- 12. Assist district with compliance audits and SELPA activities as appropriate.
- 13. Serve as liaison for out-of-district special education students and services as requested.
- 14. All other related duties as assigned.

Ability – Above average recommendations from administrative supervisors or other professionals who have observed the candidate's personal characteristics, scholastic attainment, ability to communicate effectively and classroom performance.
